

Local Chapter Ratings Criteria for Jul-Dec 2019 semester

Top 100 Local Chapters

Rating Points, R =

$\{0.1 * \text{Number of Learners Present}\}$ (value capped to 10) +
 $\{1 * \text{'Successfully Completed'}\}$ (value capped to 100) +
 $\{2 * \text{'Elite'}\} + \{5 * \text{'Silver'}\} + \{8 * \text{'Gold'}\} + \{10 * \text{'Toppers'}\}$

Based on the rating points calculated using the above formula:

- The top 10 Local Chapters (with maximum rating points) will be awarded 'AAA' rating
- The next 40 Local Chapters (with maximum rating points) will be awarded 'AA' rating
- The next 50 Local Chapters (with maximum rating points) will be awarded 'A' rating

What does Capped at 10 or 100 means?

Number present for exam ---> points are capped at 10; ie. maximum points allocated is 10

For any count above 100 present, the max points are capped at 10.

So, if the present count is say 220, multiplying by 0.1 gives 22, but the max points taken will be 10.

If the present count is below 100, say 80, it is taken as $80 \times 0.1 = 8$

Same rule applies for capped at 100 also.

It is capped because we do not want to base the ratings on sheer volume of people writing the exam.

We want to emphasize on the performance of the students and so more weightage is given to these categories.

Active Local Chapters

A Local Chapter will be recognized as an 'Active LC' if:

- A minimum of 25 learners from the LC write the exam (i.e. 'Present'), **AND**
- A minimum of 13 learners pass the exam (i.e. 'Certified')
